# Amenities

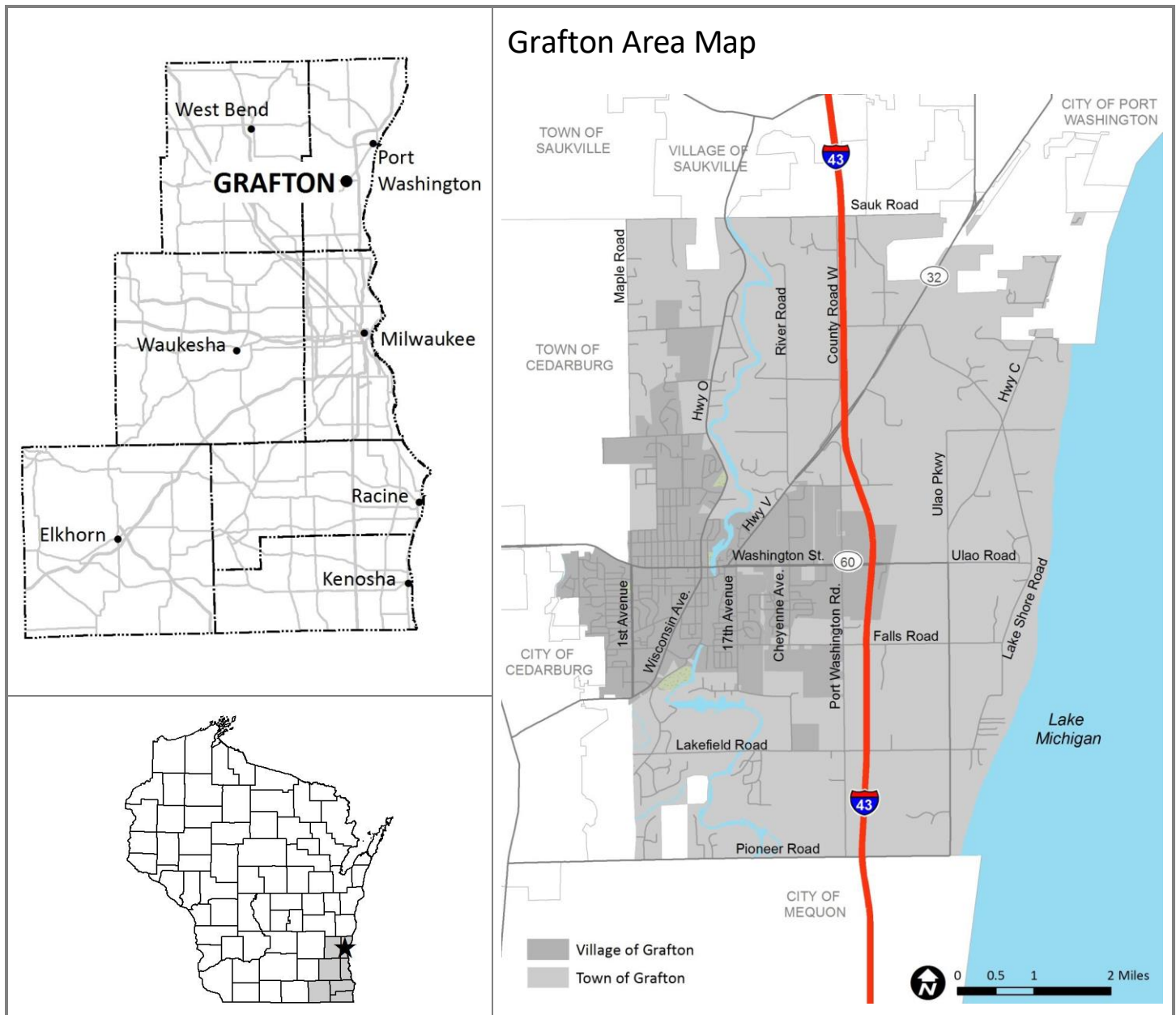
